[5] The Franklin Institute invites nominations for the 2010 Bower Award and Prize for Achievement in Science. Presented annually to an individual of any nationality for outstanding work in the basic, applied, or engineering sciences. A gold medal and a cash prize of \$250,000 are awarded to the individual selected to receive the award.

Each year, a predetermined field of study is chosen as a theme. The theme for 2010 is Earth Systems. The Franklin Institute seeks nominations of individuals who have made significant scientific contributions to our understanding of the interrelationships among Earth Systems leading to increased predictability of natural or human-induced changes on the planet. Nominations should recognize efforts that encompass various earth systems and processes, including: the Earth's interior, lithosphere, hydrosphere, biosphere, and atmosphere, biogeochemical cycles, and Earth history.
